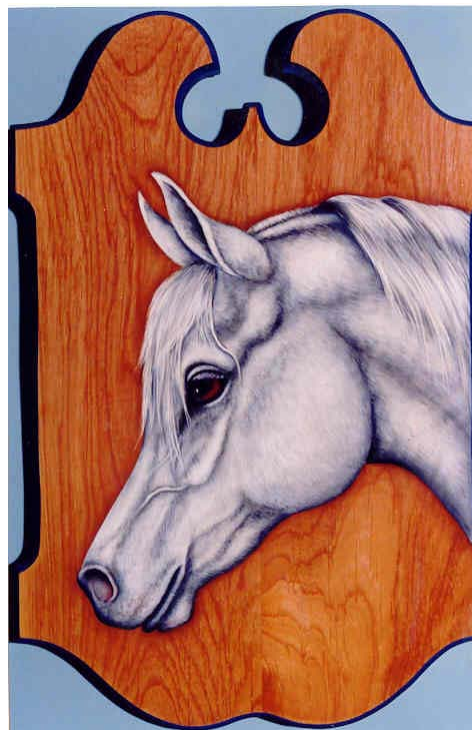

The ARABIAN HORSE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW was held at the new location this year. Tulsa, Oklahoma has built an enormous facility for livestock events. It's goodbye to Albuquerque and Louisville.

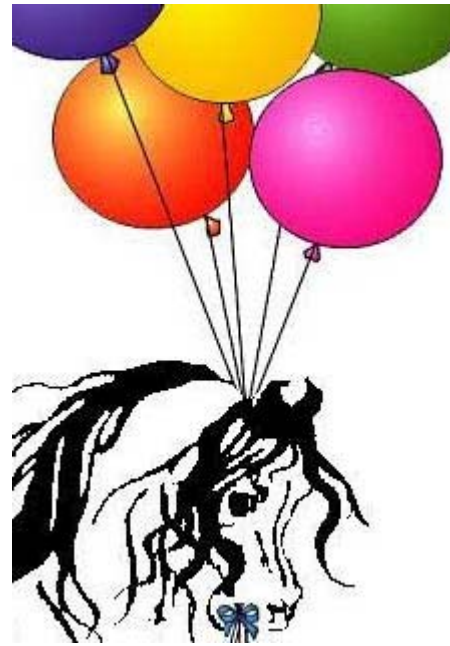

We have hired a judge for the Spring Fiesta. Ann Judge-Wegner has agreed to judge our show May 14-17 at the Rose Palace. Ann was chosen as the US Nationals judge for Western Pleasure. Ann is the proud owner and rider for the famous horse "Thunder" that is the mascot for the Denver Broncos. We have a USEF Technical Delegate hired so if we can get a USEF "S" judge we can offer FEI Dressage classes. We have had several requests for the upper level tests.

We are planning to NOT have a two-judge show. Our feelings are that it is a great risk financially to do that. We would have to spend approximately \$12,000 more and charge about \$20.00 per class extra. This may cut down on our entries and we did not feel that it was worth the risk this year due to economy.

AHA Annual Convention 2008 by Bill Eash

The annual convention was held in Denver Colorado this year. AAHA sent three delegates to the convention on the 19th and returned on the 23rd. Jeanne Harford, Liz Williams and I all traveled together via Southwest Airlines and then enjoyed the 100-mile shuttle ride from the huge Denver Airport to the Marriott where the convention was to take place.

This is the time where the delegates of AHA get together and present their resolutions that change USEF rules, bylaws or rules in the AHA handbook. The resolutions had been written and submitted to AHA earlier in the summer so they could be printed and available to everyone attending. This year there were 37 resolutions submitted. Each resolution is assigned to go before particular committees. These committees can approve or disapprove the resolutions. The author of the resolution can modify and change to fit what a committee may want if they so desire. In most cases each committee meets twice, once to go over the resolutions and take up any business as necessitates. If a resolution is modified then it can be reviewed and voted upon at the next meeting. The AAHA team of delegates went there separate directions. We attended, Sport Horse, Dressage, Youth, Youth Nationals Show Commission, Sport Horse National Show Commission and others. Almost all meetings are open and typically have straw votes where everyone can vote and then a vote restricted to committee members.

There were many resolutions this year and as usual many were withdrawn due to some politics that occurred and sometimes the author decides the resolution has no chance to pass. There were several resolutions this year that drew most of the attention. Resolution 17-08 Rescind the Halter Score Sheet, 18-08 Allow the use of Halter Score sheet to be optional at Class "A" shows, 25-08 Rescind Concurrent judged shows and 29-08 Hunter Pleasure Class Specifications.

Resolution 17 was withdrawn. I think the proponent felt that it had no chance of passing. Resolution 18 did not pass. It was felt by the majority that it would not be fair to have two separate scoring systems for horses that are being qualified for the Regional and National Championships. Resolution 25 did not pass which means that as of December 08 we can have shows with two judges, adjudicate one class concurrently. Resolution 29 did pass which was trying to reshape the hunter pleasure horse to a horse that looks and moves more like a hunter. It remains to be seen if the judges will enforce this new rule to the satisfaction of the proponents.

The annual convention will be in Reno Nevada in 09 and in Orlando Florida in 10.

The delegates of AAHA would like to thank our club for allowing us to represent them at the convention. At our last AAHA club meeting we went over the resolutions and discussed them and got the feed back of the attendees. I feel that we brought home what we wanted except for

Resolution 25.

Please note that once again AAHA can be proud. We were finalists in two of the four Club Excellence awards and WINNERS in the Membership Retention and Recruitment category. Thanks to Mark Williams and all his work for this success.
